RULES AND REGULATIONS

Art 1 This peculiar race will allow unclassified young french skiers to take part in an international race for children.

Art 2 This race is open to any young girls and boys born between 1993 and 1996 from Benjamin/Minim categories (Children 1 and 2).

Art 3 **QUALIFYING RACES - MONDAY 7TH AND TUESDAY 8RD APRIL**

Boys

A pre-qualification race will take place on 2 different Giant Slalom runs dividing the first 60 french Benjamin and Minim skiers in the order of the French Championships starting list.

The first 50 of each run will race face to face on a Giant Slalom in one run and the first 40 will be qualified for the international races.

Girls

A pre-qualification race will take place on 2 different Giant Slalom runs dividing the first 60 french Benjamin and Minim skiers in the order of the french Championships starting list.

The first 40 of each run will race face to face on a Giant Slalom in on run and the first 30 will be qualified for the international races.

Art 4 A classification of the best French Ski Club will be made, according to the highest number of skiers qualified for the international races. The coaches of the best french Ski Club will be offered a gift from the **DJC-DALLOZ** society.

Art 5 **INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN RACES**

These races will take place on Wednesday 9th and Thursday 10th April 2008.

The French qualified racers will start in the order of their qualifying race ranking.

NB: *The Organising Committee reserves the right to replace the FIS Super G in a FIS Giant Slalom (1 run only) if bad weather conditions do not allow a Super G to take place.*

Moreover all racers qualified for FIS races must have the 'Statement of discharge in correlation with a request for a FIS international licence' signed by themselves, their parents or their legal guardian.
