Rules for the FIS races – Scara 2020

• Art 1 CATEGORIES AND QUOTAS

This race is for categories U14 (2007/2006) and U16 (2005/2004)
The races will be organised following the FIS rules (ICR)

The quotas for the international racers on the Scara race are :

- 6 children U16 (maximum 4 per gender in each category)
- 4 children U14

No more children will be accepted

• Art 2 INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN RACES

The races will take place on Thursday April 2th and Friday April 3th 2020. The races are open to any young girls and boys born between 2004 and 2007 from U14 and U16 categories. The races will be organised according to the prevailing FIS rules.

The French qualified racers will start in the order of their qualifying race ranking.

If the weather conditions do not permit a FIS Super G, the Organising Committee reserves the right to replace it by a FIS Giant Slalom (1 run only).

All racers qualified for FIS races must have the 'Statement of discharge' in correlation with a request for a FIS international licence signed by themselves, their parents or their legal guardian and a copy of their passport.

• Art 3 ENTRIES (must be send by the National Ski Association)

For the race on April 2th Entry and accommodation requests closing time: **Sunday March 29th at 02:00 pm**

For the race on April 3th Entry and accommodation requests closing time: **Sunday March 29th at 02:00 pm**

To enter the races, the following information are requested:

Name of the Team, first name and last name of each racer + gender + year of birth + bib draw Group number*

It's mandatory to write the names (last names, than first name) as clear as possible in capital letter

As the draw will be made by computer, it is absolutely essential to list the athletes on the entry form following the order you want them to start.

***No changes of groups will be accepted during the team captains meeting.**

• Art 4 STARTING ORDER

SUPER G: according to the Sub Committee Youth and Children statement

Classification of nation according to world rank

- **rank 1:** nation with 10 or more racers in top 100 world FIS rank.
- **rank 2:** nation between 5 and 9 racers in top 100 world FIS rank.
- **rank 3:** nation between 0 and 4 racers in top 100 world FIS rank. All other nations.
 - **Group 1:** Draw with all nations, 1 racer per nation (1st racer Entry Form).
 - **Group 2:** Draw with nations in rank 1 (2nd racer) + 1 host nation
 - **Group 3:** Draw with nations in rank 1 (3rd racer) and rank 2 (2nd racer) + 1 host nation
 - **Group 4:** Draw with nations in rank 1 (4th racer), rank 2 (3rd racer) and rank 3 (2nd racer) + 1 host nation
 - **Group 5:** Draw with nations in rank 2 (4rd racer) and rank 3 (3rd racer) + 1 host nation
 - **Other groups:** Draw with nations in rank 3 (4th racer) and host nation

SLALOM

Group 1:



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The first group will contain one athlete from each nation registered. Each nation is allotted only one start place.

Group 2 - 3 - 4: Same as group 1

Last group: The last group consists of the athletes of the organizing nation, in double quota. If the number of competing athletes exceeds the double quota a separate group will be drawn after the entire starting field in the same procedure as group 1. The team leaders are responsible for the identification of participants in each group.

• **Art 5 RACE OFFICE**

The team captain's meetings will take place at the "Club des Sports de Val d'Isère": first meeting, Wednesday 1th April 2020 at 7:00 pm. The office hours will take place in the "Club des Sports de Val d'Isère" from 9.00 Am till 7.00 pm.

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• **Art 6 ACCIDENT INSURANCE**

Each racer must be insured in case of accident: each racer must have a valid national licence which insures him for practicing alpine skiing in competition.

The Organising Committee will decline responsibility for any accident consequences or material damage which may occur out of training or competition periods.

• **Art 7 ACCOMMODATION**

The Organising committee will accommodate each team for a maximum of:

→ 3 nights,

→ 9 persons, including a maximum of 3 coaches.

These nights will be charged to the organising committee only once received a valid and signed entry form, send by your national ski association with exact information about arrival and departure during the race days only (3 nights max).

Extra rooms can be organized by the organising committee, these extras and all kind of extras will be paid directly by the team itself to the hotel.

The first 5 skiers of each category will receive a cup. The winner of each international race will win his weight in sweets and candies.
