

Rules for the FIS races – Scara 2023

• Art 1: CATEGORIES AND QUOTAS

This race is for categories U14 (2009/2010) and U16 (2007/2008).

The quotas for the international racers on the Scara race are:

- **6 children U16 (maximum 4 per gender in each category)**
- **4 children U14**

No more children will be accepted

• Art 2: INTERNATIONAL CHILDREN RACES

The races will take place on Thursday April 6th and Friday April 7th, 2023. The races are open to any young girls and boys born between 2007 and 2010 from U14 and U16 categories.

The races will be organised according to the prevailing FIS rules.

The French qualified racers will start in the order of their qualifying race ranking.

If the weather conditions do not permit a FIS Super G, the Organising Committee reserves the right to replace it by a FIS Giant Slalom (1 run only).

All racers qualified for FIS races must have the 'Statement of discharge' in correlation with a request for a FIS international licence signed by themselves, their parents or their legal guardian and a copy of their passport.

• Art 3: ENTRY FORM

Entry form must be sent by the National Ski Association at courses@valsport.org only.

Entry and accommodation requests closing time: **Friday March 31st at 01:00 pm**

To enter the races, the following information are requested on the entry form:

- ✓ **Name of the Team**
- ✓ **First name of each racer in capital letters**
- ✓ **Last name of each racer in capital letters**
- ✓ **Gender of each racer**
- ✓ **Year of birth of each racer**
- ✓ **Bib draw Group number of each racer**

As the draw will be made by computer, it's absolutely essential to list the athletes on the entry form following the order in which you want them to start according to Group number.

PLEASE NOTE THAT NO CHANGES OF GROUPS WILL BE POSSIBLE ON SITE OR DURING TEAM CAPTAIN MEETINGS.

- **Art 4: STARTING ORDER**

SUPER G: according to the Sub Committee Youth and Children statement Classification of nation according to world rank:

- **rank 1:** nations with 10 or more racers in top 100 world FIS rank.
- **rank 2:** nations between 5 and 9 racers in top 100 world FIS rank.
- **rank 3:** nations between 0 and 4 racers in top 100 world FIS rank. All other nations.
 - **Group 1:** Draw with all nations, 1 racer per nation (1st racer in the entry Form).
 - **Group 2:** Draw with nations in rank 1 (2nd racer in the entry form) + 1 host nation.
 - **Group 3:** Draw with nations in rank 1 (3rd racer in the entry form) and rank 2 (2nd racer in the entry form) + 1 host nation.
 - **Group 4:** Draw with nations in rank 1 (4th racer in the entry form), rank 2 (3rd racer in the entry form) and rank 3 (2nd racer in the entry form) + 1 host nation.
 - **Group 5:** Draw with nations in rank 2 (4th racer in the entry form) and rank 3 (3rd racer in the entry form) + 1 host nation.
 - **Other groups:** Draw with nations in rank 3 (4th racer in the entry form) and host nation.

SLALOM

Group 1: The first group will contain one athlete from each nation registered. Each nation is allotted only one start place.

Group 2 - 3 - 4: Same as group 1

Last group: The last group consists of the athletes of the host nation, in double quota. If the number of competing athletes exceeds the double quota a separate group will be drawn after the entire starting field in the same procedure as group 1.

The team leaders are responsible for the identification of participants in each group.

- **Art 5: RACE OFFICE**

The team captain's meetings will take place at the Club des Sports. First meeting, **Wednesday April 5th, 2023, at 5:00 pm.**

Important: Declaration and copy of your athlete passport can be sent by email before the first TCM. If you can't send it by email before, you may submit before the TCM when the race office opens (for coaches to sign entries).

The race office opens **Wednesday April 5th, 2023, at 3:00 pm** for signing entries.

- **Art 6: ACCIDENT INSURANCE**

Each racer must be insured in case of accident: each racer must have a valid national licence which insures him for practicing alpine skiing in competition.

The Organising Committee declines responsibility for any accident consequences or material damage which may occur out of training or competition periods.

- **Art 7: ACCOMMODATION**

The Organising committee will accommodate each team for a maximum of:

- **3 nights**
- **9 persons, including a maximum of 3 coaches**

Bookings are made directly by the organizing committee upon reception of a valid and signed entry form, sent by your National Ski Association with exact information about arrival and departure during the race days only (3 nights max, from the 4th to the 7th of April).

You will receive the confirmation of the details of your accommodation on Sunday 2nd of April.

Extra nights and persons will be charged and will have to be paid at the Club des Sports directly.
